BIOGRAPHIES

PRESIDENT-ELECT/PRESIDENT-ELUI TO BE ELECTED/A ELIRE

JOHN C. COURTNEY is a Professor of Political Science, University of Saskatchewan, Saskatoon, Saskatchewan. He holds degrees from the University of Manitoba (B.A.) 1958, University of Western Ontario (M.B.A.) 1960, and Duke University (M.A. 1962 and Ph.D.) 1964. He is the author of The Selection of National Party Leaders in Canada (Macmillan, 1973) and numerous articles on Canadian parties, elections, electoral systems and political leadership in the Canadian Journal of Political Science, Canadian Public Administration and other professional journals. Professor Courtney has edited Voting in Canada (Prentice-Hall, 1967) and The Canadian House of Commons: Essays in Honour of Norman Ward (University of Calgary Press, 1985). He is currently a member of the Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council of Canada, and in 1986-87 he will be a Visiting Scholar at the Center for International Affairs, Harvard University. From 1981 to 1984 Professor Courtney was English-language Co-Editor of the Canadian Journal of Political Science

KHAYYAM ZEV PALTIEL, Professor and former Chairman of the Department of Political Science at Carleton was born and educated in Montréal. Gold medalist at McGill and M.A. (Toronto) after further studies at the New School of Social Research and McGill, he earned the doctorate from the Hebrew University of Jerusalem. At Carleton since 1963, he has been Visiting Professor at McGill, Ottawa and Jerusalem. He is the author of the standard work Political Party Financing in Canada.

On the executive of the CPSA (1968-70) he has chaired the programme committee (in 1968) and the Committee on Parliamentary Internships (1970-72). A member of the Academic Panel of the Canada Council from 1970 to 1974, Professor Paltiel has been secretary of the Study Group on Political Finance of the International Political Science Association.

In addition he has experience on the interface between university and government as consultant and researcher for a number of provincial and federal agencies and commissions, most notably as Research Director and Acting Secretary of the Federal Advisory Committee on Election Expenses. Studies on constitutional questions for the Native Council of Canada have been used as working papers for the Constitutional Conferences of First Ministers on aboriginal rights.

KIM RICHARD NOSSAL received his B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. from the University of Toronto. In 1976, he joined the Department of Political Science at McMaster University, where he is an Associate professor. He is the author of The Politics of Canadian Foreign Policy (1985), has edited two books on aspects of Canadian foreign policy and has published in International Journal, Canadian Journal of Political Science, Etudes Internationales, and Foreign Affairs, among others. In 1978 he served as chairman of the international relations section of the CPSA programme committee and since 1984 has been a member of the CPSA's publications committee.

DOUGLAS G. LONG is an associate professor of political theory teaching in the Department of Political Science at the University of Western Ontario. He obtained his B.A. and M.A. at the University of Toronto and his Ph.D. from the University of London. His research interests are in 18th century English political thought. A major publication is Bentham or Liberty (1977) and he is currently editing the collected works of Jeremy Bentham for publication in 1988.

JENNIFER SMITH, Assistant professor, Dalhousie University. Degrees: B.A. Honours, McMaster University. M.A. and Ph.D. at Dalhousie. Parliamentary Intern from 1972 to 1973. Teaching and research in Canadian politics, in particular: Constitutional matters, issues in Canadian political thought and issues in Canadian federalism. Publications on judicial review, The Supreme Court of Canada, and the debate on intra-state federalism. Currently working on Nova Scotia politics during the postwar period.

TERESA RAKOWSKA-HARMSTONE, Professor and Chairperson, Department of Political Science, Carleton University. Past-Director of the Institute of Soviet and East European Studies at Carleton. B.A. Honours, McGill University; M.A. Radcliffe College; Ph.D. Harvard. Author and Editor of numerous publications in comparative Communist politics and foreign policy including Russia and Nationalism in Central Asia: The Case of Tadzhikistan (Hopkins 1970) and Communism in Eastern Europe, second revised edition (Indiana & Manchester Presses 1984).

This note will bring you up to date on the Association's current activities. Should you wish to obtain more information or simply discuss any of the matters raised in this note do not hesitate to get in touch with me or write to Joan Pond.

Vous savez peut-être déjà que notre secrétaire-trésorière Sharon Sutherland a démissionné en novembre dernier et que le Conseil d'administration m'a prié de terminer son mandat. Je voudrais ici remercier Sharon pour le bon travail qu'elle a fait à l'Association.

1. Amendments to the Constitution.

The Report of the Committee to revise the

Constitution (R.K. Carty (Chair), J.P. Gaboury, D.V. Smiley) was approved by the Board in May 1985 and will be presented to the Annual General Meeting. The proposed amendments to the Constitution as you will notice only try to update over Constitution so that it corresponds more accurately to the current practice. You will find both The Constitution currently in force and the proposed amendments on p. 44 and following, of this "Bulletin".

2. Les cotisations à l'Association.

Nous serons probablement et malheureusement tenus d'augmenter les cotisations pour l'année prochaine. 3. The Parliamentary Internships Programme

Robert Jackson's term as Director of the Parliamentary Internships Programme is coming to an end of term. Robert Jackson is to be congratulated and warmly thanked for the great work he has done at the helm of the Programme for nine years.

Conrad Winn (Carleton) has been appointed Director of the Programme for a Three year period (July 1986 - June 1989).

The Programme is now actively trying to raise money for the coming years. On page 35 you will find an article on the Parliamentary Internships Programme that we would encourage you to read.

Eh bien vos pressions ont porté fruit. Le Conseil choisira deux évaluateurs de l'extérieur et il enverra aux candidats des commentaires des évaluateurs.

- Le Budget Wilson

Le budget Wilson, comme vous le savez probablement, ne prévoit aucune augmentation au budget du Conseil de recherches en sciences humaines à partir de l'année 1987-88. Le Conseil devra alors aller chercher des fonds auprès du secteur privé et le gouvernement s'engage à lui verser un montant égal à celui qu'il obtiendra des entreprises privées. On connaît mal comment seront définis ces "fonds venant du secteur privé". Nous voulons être consultés avant qu'ils soient définis. Vous nous aideriez grandement en écrivant au ministre Benoit Bouchard (Chambre des communes, Ottawa, K1A 0A6) pour lui indiquer qu'il doit consulter la Fédération et les associations intéressées. Soyez assurés que votre lettre compte.

5. The Annual Meeting in Winnipeg

We hope to see as many political scientists as possible at our Annual Meeting in Winnipeg. I should like to thank the Department of the University of Manitoba for hosting the Annual Meeting and the Department of the University of Winnipeg for hosting the meeting of the Board of Directors.

Don Carmichael and his Committee have decided to take advantage of this much less labour-intensive way of handling things. This will mean, however, that there will be no pre-registration process involving free labels and that form of early access to papers. Persons involved in sessions will, as usual, receive early copies from the papergiver responsible. Other persons might try writing directly to the authors, whose academic "homes" are indicated in the Preliminary Programme. Please present your registration receipt at our desk at The Learned in order to obtain you copy of the Final Programme. Our desk will also, as usual, act as "message central" for Association doings at Manitoba.
